History of the Institution	<p>Sri Guru Granth Sahib World University was established to commemorate the historic event of 400th anniversary of the compilation and first installation of Sri Adi (Guru) Granth Sahib in the year 2004. Thanks to the inspiring vision of Hon'ble Sardar Parkash Singh Badal and dynamic leadership of Sardar Sukhbir Singh Badal, the dream of entire Sikh Community was realized in the form of Sri Guru Granth Sahib World University. Jathedar Avtar Singh, Former President, SGPC played a pioneering role in establishing the University. However, the University is privileged to have Prof. Kirpal Singh Badungar, President, SGPC as the Chancellor. Prof. Badungar is a renowned Sikh Scholar and Educationist under whose able stewardship, the University is bound to grow leaps and bounds, and will carve a unique identity of its own in the coming years.</p> <p>The University has a huge campus (136.75 acres), state-of-the-art infrastructure, highly qualified faculty, congenial and stimulating academic environment. The University is running twenty nine departments under twelve schools, focusing on intensive study/research/teaching in the areas of World Religions, Cultures, Eastern and Western thought systems and other courses under the heads of Basic and Applied Sciences, Engineering Sciences, Commerce and Management, Arts and Humanities, Social Sciences and Performing Arts. Act) Activities at the University from March 28, 2015 to September 16, 2015 1. The University celebrated Ardas Divas on April 22, 2015 to seek the blessings of the Almighty after the completion of the academic session for the success of the students. 2. Sikh Educational Awareness Conference was organized on April 24, 2015 at University campus in which Principals as well as senior faculty members from all the SGPC colleges participated. In the course on "Ethics and Human Values and Communication Skills" were discussed during the course. 3. English translation of the Punjabi book titled "mzHbW dw sPr" (written by Dr. H.S. Mehboob) by Dr. Gurtaran Singh was released on May 21, 2015. S. Sukhdev Singh Dhindsa, Hon'ble Member Rajya Sabha was the Chief Guest on the occasion. 4. To make the students aware of their cultural heritage, a Teej Festival was celebrated on August 26, 2015 in Bebe Nanki Girls Hostel in which all the girl students and staff participated. The function was inaugurated by S. Tarlochan Singh, Ex-Chairman, Minority Commission and Member, Rajya Sabha. Various activities related to Teej were conducted. 5. Sports Day was celebrated on August 26, 2015. To mark this occasion, number of sports events were planned (i.e. Cross Country race for Boys &amp; Girls separately, Circle Kabaddi for Men, Tug of War for Men and Hockey match among Academy Girls). 6. Three Girls of University Hockey Academy were invited for National Camp by Hockey India namely: 1. Manpreet Kaur 2. Navpreet Kaur 3. Navneet Kaur 7. The Foundation Day of the University was celebrated on September 01, 2015. Jathedar, Takht Sri Kesgarh Sahib, Giani Mal Singh; Jathedar, Avtar Singh, President, SGPC and Trust Secretary, S. Sukhdev Singh Bhaur were present on the occasion. 8. The Foundation Stone of General Hari Singh Nalwa Astro turf Hockey Stadium was laid by President SGPC and Chancellor of the University, Hon'ble Jathedar Avtar Singh ji. The stadium will be constructed at an approximate cost of Rs. 5.5 crore. 9. The work for the construction of Sports Pavilion is under progress and is expected to be completed by the end of October, 2015. The total cost involved will be approximately Rs.3.5 crores. Bebe Nanki Girls Hostel with a capacity to house 459 girls has been fully occupied by the girl students 11.
